# **Online Safety**

Recently we carried out an Online Safety questionnaire with all the pupils at school. With our children spending more time in the online world, it's really important to us to see what they're accessing and how they access it. Already we've found that the majority of pupils feel safe online and all know what to do if they have an issue online which is fantastic. However, a few pupils have spoken up about being hacked and the passwords they used. Pupils worry about having a safe and secure account on their programs. To help, I've created a top 5 hints to help keep your account secure with a better password:

1: Don't use your name, address, pet or family members in your password, choose words you that are memorable to you but random.

2: Replace letters with numbers in your words EG: use a 4 =A, 3=E, 5=S ETC.

3: Tell your parents/carers your password but no one else, even your friends.

4: Don't write your passwords down in a public or obvious place (like next to your games console or on the back of your tablet).

5: If you need a security question, choose a question and answer only you and your family know the answer to, not something obvious.

Remember, encourage your children to change their passwords if they're ever worried they've been hacked or someone knows it - it will give them and you peace of mind.

### Tough Runner Friday 7th July

On Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July, the children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will get chance to take part in a 'Tough Runner' assault course which involves a variety of exciting and challenging obstacles set up on the school field. After completing the course, which includes cargo nets, stepping through tyres and other challenges, there is a water slide and the children will get wet and muddy.

### Pirate Obstacle Course Friday 14th July

On Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July, the children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will get chance to take part in a Pirate Obstacle Course which involves a variety of exciting and challenging obstacles set up on the school field. There are some adult-operated water sprays in this activity, meaning children may get wet.

In order to take part in both of these events, it is essential that each child comes to school in their PE kit (old clothing and old trainers) and brings a full change of clothing including a change of shoes and a towel in a plastic bag with their name on. This bag will be used to bring home their wet and muddy clothes. Children without this will not be able to fully participate.
