#### English- Literacy Tree

Writing is an area we are keen to improve at our school and we are always looking at ways we can evolve our practice. 'Literacy Tree' has been up and running in all year groups since the start of the term.

This week, Miss Harris (Writing Lead) and Mr Wray have spent time monitoring the impact of our new scheme and also completing pupil interviews. All of our children have spoken excitedly about the scheme and the 'hooks' that the scheme use to make memorable experiences. In Year 1, Beegu the alien crash landed on the school site! The children received a video message from Mr Wray asking for their help to investigate this strange event. It has been talked about ever since, as we create 'Lost' posters, write letters and begin to write a narrative about a different crash landing. It is elements like this that motivate the children to write and give them inspiration to be really creative. Feedback and monitoring to date have all demonstrated a positive impact on children's writing and we are really excited about continuing this scheme over the year.






#### Adaptive Teaching

This week, our staff meeting was held by Mrs Walton (SENDCo) and Mr Wray. Teachers and Teaching Assistants attended.

It gave us a chance to explore 'Adaptive Teaching'. Standard 5 of the 'Teachers' standards' requires that teachers "adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils." This is ensuring we do not create a ceiling for the attainment of all children but consider ways to scaffold learning so all children can reach their potential. We had professional discussions in order to collate a range of strategies we might use to support children with a wide range of learning styles. Mrs Walton then collated the strategies we discussed as a team and this collaborative document will be used by all staff in school to make small changes to their lessons: in turn supporting all of the children in the classroom.





Last week the children learnt about Spring flowers. They painted a daffodil for Mother's Day and learnt how to work as a team. This week they have had a lot of fun searching for mini-beasts, studying and comparing them. Finally, they made a snail out of pipe cleaners.

#### **Book Fair**



We hope you can notice the difference. Here are some pictures of our unit now.



He has also been sending his recordings to a couple of elderly people who have dementia and live in a care home. They were both teachers earlier in life and love hearing a child read to them again.












Thank- you to everyone for your efforts with the outfits!
