Unless there is information which tells us we should do otherwise, these classes will run as normal after half-term.

We know things can change very quickly, so we will be continuing with online assemblies, wearing face coverings and all our extra preventative measures in school for the time being. Thank you to all of you for your support in this.

The current guidance is that all children who are well and not testing positive should come to school.

Whilst it is not compulsory for children of primary age to do regular Lateral Flow Device testing, they do catch positive cases early. These tests are intended if you are asymptomatic. You can order tests for your family here if this is something you feel you would like to do: Order LFD Tests

We would always suggest a PCR test if your child has been a possible contact of someone who has tested positive.

After half-term, we are required to give further information when we report positive cases in the school community, including all positive Lateral Flow Tests. Therefore, please remember to report all Covid 19 related information to: covid@swanwick.derbyshire.sch.uk
