

Parents' Meetings – Frequently Asked Questions March 2022

We were really pleased with how the last parents' meetings went, so we wanted to do something very similar this time. Hopefully, these FAQs will help you to have a smooth evening, provide some social distancing and help to keep everyone safe. We hope it helps!

What if I have C19 symptoms or have tested positive?

We ask that you stay at home and do not come to school. Please let us know if you are unable to make your appointment and we can rearrange for another time.

What time should I arrive?

Please arrive at school no more than 10 minutes before your appointment and go straight to the hall via the door near the office. We ask that you do not go to your child's classroom until five minutes before this, as there is not enough space in the corridor to wait. Each meeting will last for 10 minutes. ***Parents of children in Hazel Class will be allocated 15 minutes due to missing out on the last set of meetings.***

Where should I go first?

All parents should enter the hall near the school office. In the hall will be tables labelled with your child's class. Pick up your child's books from the appropriate table.

What should I do with the books?

Take some time to look through them and take them to your meeting. Your child's teacher will keep the books after the meeting. If you need more time, please take them back to the hall to look through and put them on the appropriate table.

Where will I go for my meetings?

All meetings will be in your child's classroom. There will be sanitiser for you to use and teachers will have set the room up so that you can socially distance.

Which classroom door should I use?

Enter the classroom via the internal door and leave the classroom via the fire door. In the case of Oak, Chestnut and Willow Class, you should use the classroom door.

Who should be in the meeting?

This is a meeting for teachers to discuss your child's progress with their parents or carers. We ask that children are not part of this conversation so that you can discuss things honestly.

Who else can I talk to?

Miss Fogg (Headteacher), Mrs Walton (SENDCo) and Mrs Stone (Pastoral Lead) will be available in the hall/PPod on both evenings.

What if my child's class teacher is absent?

We will try to let you know in advance. An alternative date will be given once the teacher has returned to school.

I can't remember my way around – what should I do?

No problem – refer to our map or come to the hall to ask someone.
