Holidays during term time

Sun Safety

The warmer weather is starting to creep in. What a long winter it has been and what a difference a bit of sunshine makes!

We know the Great British Weather can be very unpredictable, so it is always best to plan for every eventuality. We know we are a long way from summer, but on those really warm days, we want to keep everyone safe.

Some top tips for keeping safe in the sun include:

SLIP on a t-shirt (which covers the shoulders) SLOP on SPF 30+ broad spectrum UVA sunscreen.

SLAP on a broad brimmed hat.

SLIDE on quality sunglasses.

SEEK SHADE from the sun whenever possible.

Sun Safety

In the warmer weather, we ask that parents ensure that their child:

- Comes to school wearing sun cream.
 (Unfortunately, we don't have the capacity to put sun cream on children.)
- **Has a water bottle** so that they can keep hydrated during the day.
- Brings a named sun hat to school.

It is really important that your child **continues to bring a coat to school** as we know how unpredictable the weather can be.

Hay fever season ahead

We know there are many children (and adults!) who suffer from hay fever. Wherever possible, we ask that parents administer any medication before school so that your child is comfortable during the school day.
