Bug Club Relaunch!

Bug Club is a fabulous resource and is proven to improve reading attainment. Your child has been given a login and their teacher will have allocated them books to match their current reading level.

Simply go to <u>Bug Club</u> to login. The school login is- swan

Children in EYFS have had log in information sent via Tapestry, all other Year groups should use their previously allocated passwords. If your child has recently joined the school and does not have an account, please let your class teacher know.

Bug club can inspire reluctant children to read and promotes accelerated progress. As the children read their allocated books they can click on the 'bugs' in the corner of each page to win awards. As children complete the books the teachers in school are able to chart their progress and identify any areas that the child might need extra support with.

We strongly recommend that children aim to read three times per week in KS1 and five times per week in KS2 and this can be a combination of online Bug Club and their actual reading book.
