Prepositional opener	It starts with a preposition which is a word that describe where something is. For example: In the bowl, put a cup of flour and stir in a 100ml of water. Addition	To add more to a number to make a number larger in size and value.	Light travels	Light moves from one place to another. Light moves in straight lines.
